Field safety standards for commercial & multi-residential exterior cleaning operations

Dynami treats safety as a condition of every job, not a formality. All field personnel follow the practices below on every site, and the company invests directly in certifying every crew member — not only supervisors — across the training areas relevant to our work.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- Full coveralls with hood worn during power washing operations.
 - Waterproof / rain boots on all wet-work sites.
 - Chemical-resistant gloves, safety goggles, and respiratory masks worn whenever chemicals are handled, mixed, or applied.
 - High-visibility clothing worn in parking areas, loading zones, and other sites with vehicle or pedestrian traffic.
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Site Hazard Awareness

- Crews complete a walk-through of each site before starting work to identify slip/trip hazards, vehicle traffic, confined spaces (chutes, compactors, catch basins), and any elevated or hard-to-access work areas.
 - Chemical handling and storage follows WHMIS guidelines, including proper labeling and safe data sheet (SDS) access on-site.
 - Equipment (hoses, reels, pressure washers, aerial equipment) is inspected before use on every job.
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Traffic & Pedestrian Control

- Cones, signage, and barricades placed around active work zones, hose runs, and equipment to keep pedestrians and vehicles clear.
 - Work in shared spaces (lobbies, parking structures, walkways) is coordinated with property management or on-site staff to manage access and timing.
 - High-visibility clothing (see PPE) worn at all times in traffic-exposed areas.
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Water Management

- Vacuum recovery is used to contain and remove wastewater on sites where runoff control is required.
 - Berms and above-drain filtration products are deployed around active work areas and nearby catch basins / storm drains to contain runoff and prevent debris, sediment, or chemical residue from entering the storm system.
 - Chemical use and discharge follow municipal and provincial guidelines for the site and service type.
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Incident Reporting

- Any injury, incident, or near-miss is reported immediately to the on-site supervisor and escalated to Dynami management the same day.
- All incidents are documented in an incident report, including cause, response, and any corrective action taken.

Training & Certification

- Dynami's policy is to certify every crew member — not just management — in every training area applicable to our work, including WHMIS, Working at Heights, Fall Protection, Lockout/Tagout, and Confined Space Entry.
- Ownership holds WHMIS, Working at Heights, and aerial lift (LIFT) licensing, in addition to the certifications above.
- Certifications are renewed on schedule and available for review as part of our vendor compliance package.
